Cultural Dive: Transformative Encounters on an African Mission

Reflecting on my recent trip to Kenya and South Sudan, my preconceived notions of these lands and their people have been not only challenged but fundamentally transformed. I had heard a myriad of narratives, shaping my preconceptions. Initially met with a subtle resistance born out of unfamiliarity, this feeling soon morphed into an overwhelming sense of delight as I delved deeper into the pulsating heart of these communities.

No amount of prior reading or storytelling could have prepared me for the raw authenticity of the experience. It was the conversations held under the shade of acacia trees, the vibrant colors of the market stalls, and the melange of scents in the bustling streets that truly etched the essence of this place into my conscious-

ness. Engaging with the locals, witnessing their daily struggles and triumphs, and partaking in their ancient customs and rituals created a tapestry of understanding that transcended mere observation.

Yet, the journey was not without its unexpected trials. As the firefight raged on, I watched in disbelief as my friends fell one by one, leaving me as the last one standing from our raiding group. The weight of the situation left me in a state of shock and confusion, In that moment, it felt like my entire world was collapsing. But then, a glimmer of hope emerged from the darkness. Faint strains of music reached my ears, and I couldn't help but wonder who could be singing in such a

dire situation. Driven by curiosity and the need for a change, I picked myself up and followed the sound. I found myself outside a church. Someone beckoned me inside, I entered, not knowing what to expect.

I sat down with the pastor under a starry sky, cradling a cup of overly sweetened chai in my hands, while pesky mosquitoes buzzed around my ankles. As I listened to the pastor as he shared his remarkable testimony, a journey that had transformed his life. Just a few short years ago, he had been a youth leader, dreaming of the next cattle raid, amassing weapons and ammunition, plotting raids, and glorifying a life of theft and violence. This way of life is all too common for many young individuals, raised in an environment that idealizes proving one's manhood through acts of violence and becoming renowned warriors.

However, against all odds, God intervened and rescued him, turning his life around in ways he never imagined. When I asked if he had enjoyed his previous life, he responded with a resounding "no." He had felt trapped, scared, and utterly hopeless. It wasn't until he experienced true freedom that he realized the extent of his captivity and fear.

n August 2023, my husband and I had the opportunity to fulfill a long-held dream by visiting Kakuma, a sprawling refugee camp nestled in the rugged terrain of northwestern Kenya. From the moment we set foot in this vibrant yet challenging environment, we were enveloped by a palpable sense of resilience and hope that seemed to permeate the air. It was a dream nurtured over years, originating from our shared experiences on a mission trip that had brought us together initially. Our desire to share this transformative experience with our own children was realized in Kakuma, a place that had become a temporary home for approximately 250,000 people from 20 different nations, each with their unique stories of displacement, loss, and perseverance.

The week in Kakuma was marked by a series of intense and deeply affecting encounters. Guided by the local pastors and accompanied by the sturdy GFI trucks, we embarked on the responsibility of leading the children's program, a task that stirred both excitement and apprehension within me. Crafting the activities and lessons for the children's program, I grappled with the weight of the impact our presence could have on these young, impressionable minds. The initial day was met with the echoes of the pastors' calls inviting the camp's residents to join our gatherings, a poignant moment that reinforced the significance of the work ahead of us.

Our curriculum aimed to weave a narrative of hope and redemption, beginning with the foundational stories of creation, the fall, Noah's Ark, and culminating in the life of Jesus and the significance of the cross. Our days were filled with music, games, puppetry, and collective prayers, gradually fostering a sense of warmth and trust within the children. Overcoming their initial hesitance, we witnessed a gradual transformation as their guarded expressions gave way to genuine moments of joy and camaraderie, serving as a testament to the power of faith to transcend even the most challenging circumstances.

In addition to the children's program, Becki and I conducted seminars for the Sunday school teachers within the camp, engaging in a collaborative exchange of knowledge and faith. We delved into strategies for creating an enriching educational environment, explored innovative teaching methods, and discussed the spiritual applications of biblical teachings, fostering a sense of collective growth and mutual encouragement. The dedication and fervor displayed by these young educators were a powerful reminder of the transformative potential embedded within the community itself.

Our days in Kakuma were further punctuated by the vibrant cultural dances, impassioned sermons led by Pastor Peter, and heartfelt communal prayers that resonated throughout the camp. Witnessing

the profound impact of our collective efforts, as hundreds of individuals surrendered themselves to the grace of Jesus, seeking solace and redemption, left an indelible mark on my heart. It became evident that the impact of our mission extended far beyond the confines of the structured programs and seminars, permeating the very fabric of the community and serving as a beacon of hope and resilience amidst the trials of daily life in the camp.

Reflecting on our time in Kakuma, I was filled with a profound sense of gratitude for the experiences shared, a deep respect for the resilience of the camp's residents, and an enduring sense of hope kindled by their unwavering spirit. The memories of shared laughter and moments of joy, the echoes of heartfelt prayers reverberating through the camp, and the enduring faith that anchored the community in the face of adversity would remain etched in my memory for years to come.

May the encounters and lessons gleaned from our time in Kakuma continue to serve as a testament to the enduring power of faith and the resilience of the Father. I am forever grateful for the privilege of being a part of this transformative journey and for the unwavering grace of the God we so ardently serve.

Our Impact in South Sudan

We are excited to share the ways in which our collective efforts are making a lasting impact in South Sudan. Through the investment of our time, talents, and finances, we are driving positive change in three key areas:

- 1. Infrastructure Enhancement: We have installed and financed a solar system, contributing to improved infrastructure Future plans include constructing a shelter for vehicles, a workshop at the mission station, and the installation of beehives Sharing agricultural knowledge is crucial in a region where expertise, materials, and finances are often lacking for such projects.
- 2. Inspiring the Youth: Engaging with children and teenagers from local schools has proven to be a source of enthusiasm and inspiration. Simple initiatives, such as utilizing three on-site sewing machines to create school uniforms and teach mothers valuable skills, have a profound impact.
- 3. Empowering Female Leaders: We are committed to supporting and stabilizing local communities by providing training for female leaders. In South Sudanese churches, where genders are traditionally separated, this initiative fills a crucial gap in leadership training, contributing to the building of the Kingdom of God.
